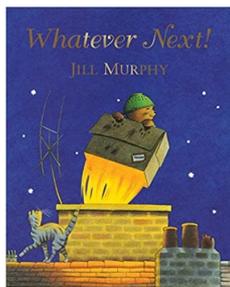


Please help
