This term we are learning:

Year 2 Curriculum

Can you believe that the children are about to enter their last term at Lark Hall! Much of the hard work has been done and now it is a question of refining and embedding what has been learnt so that the children are ready to attend Flax Hill feeling confident and ready to make a flying start.

In English we are aiming to introduce some writing based on a "real event". Usually, and rather strangely, something tends to go missing in the Year 2 classroom at about this time of year! The children will be asked to investigate it and use those investigations to inspire their writing. Let's hope the school trophy doesn't get stolen again! No doubt our school cleaner Mrs Mopp— will have seen something important.

In maths, we have had some fun with some practical tasks-including cooking. As we move into the Summer Term, we will be introducing more problem solving (worded problems) -again to give them a foundation of skills they will need to apply in Flax Hill. In Geography we will be developing mapping skills— starting with mapping the classroom and building up to how the world is mapped. In History, we will be nursing our way through the a topic relating to Florence Nightingale!

In DT, the children will have the opportunity to design and make some healthy, vegetarian wraps. It's always lovely to have a little picnic on the field with the results of our hard work. In Art we are moving onto printing skills which is always a bit messy. Mr Roberts will do his best to remember the aprons! In R.E. we will look at a range of ceremonies in Christianity such as baptism, weddings and funerals.

In science, having completed our study of plants, we are now moving on to animals including humans and their offspring. Finally, our year 2 PHSE subject is Relationships.

Year 1 Curriculum

In history and geography we are starting new topics being Castles and Life in the City (comparing life in Brazil to this country) In R.E. the class will be looking at Hinduism and what Hindu's celebrate.
