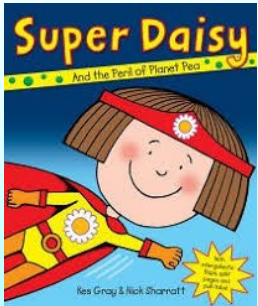

Summer Term 1

Pre School

Message from the teachers:

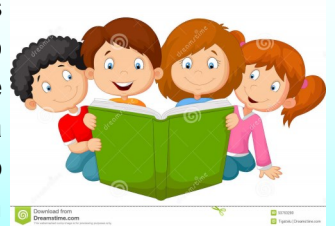
