### This term we are learning:

This half term we are continuing our maths mastery sessions with the children. We have already noticed that the children are becoming more secure with number and using their number skills more confidently. Please encourage your children to count, add and subtract where you can.

In Pre school this half term, the children will be learning about life cycles and colour. This will include reading books like the hungry caterpillar and the rainbow fish.

In Reception, we will be looking at traditional tales focusing particularly those featuring kings, queens and castles. Please ask your children to retell these tales at home. We will also be looking at Spring and Easter near the end of the term.

### Reception Drawing Club

The Reception children have recently started completing drawing club a few times a week. Children are immersed in a story and a wealth of linked vocabulary. They are then inspired to draw and write in a truly creative way. Reception parents/guardians will be able to see examples of drawing club work at the next parent's evening.
