

This term we are learning:

The Pre school children will be exploring the topic of Traditional Tales in the first Spring half term. This is a great opportunity to retell these stories at home - you probably don't even need the books. We will use the stories as a starting point to develop children's independent learning inside and outside. In phonics children will be playing lots of listening games and listening to different sounds.





In Reception, we will be exploring the broad topic of "Our Wonderful World". As part of our work on this we will be learning more about where we live. The children will also be studying the local area so if you are walking to school maybe you could point out Suggested Home Learning Activities some of the different land uses (school, houses, shops, flats, church). They will learn about Tamworth now and in the past, so please talk about historical

building such as the castle and the churches. They will also be exploring contrasting environments, eg the countryside, seaside or the city.

In phonics, Reception children will be learning phase 3 graphemes: ai, ee,igh, oa, oo, ar, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, er. While in maths we will be covering numbers 6-10 in depth. Please try to count with your child everyday.

Important: Please bring in a named water bottle everyday.

Naming uniform

Don't forget to check that all the items your children bring into school including gloves and hats are named. It is always easier to return lost items when they are clearly named.
